GENERAL RULES

All entries must be in writing, signed by owner or authorized agent, and accompanied by proper fees. Parent or guardian must sign the entry of a junior exhibitor.

Check policy: OPEN CHECKS will not be accepted with original entries. Full payment for classes entered and Office Fees must accompany all entries. Exhibitors wishing to add classes during the show may leave an OPEN CHECK (separate from their entry fees) at the show office. Scratched classes will not be deducted from any applicable fees. CHECKS RETURNED for any reason will be assessed a \$25.00 processing fee. *NOTE: if we have received an NSF check in the past, you will be required to pay cash or by credit card, in addition to paying outstanding monies owed.*

Exhibitors canceling entries after closing date shall forfeit their entry fee except in case of disability of horse or rider. Entry fees will be refunded (less office fee) only upon presentation to the Show Secretary a Certificate of Disability from a qualified Veterinarian/Physician *prior to the first class the horse/rider is entered.*

Post Entries: Should be made at least 3 classes prior to entering the arena.

Amateur Cards: Exhibitor must have either a WSH, USEF, or Breed amateur card, which will be inspected at the show unless a photocopy is included with the entry. In Amateur Classes, a current USEF, WSH, or Breed Amateur card is required, or affidavit may be made with the show secretary.

Registration Papers (copies please) *must* accompany entry. “*” denotes classes requiring registration papers.

Conduct: Show management reserves the right to refuse any entry or an exhibitor or the participant of any agent, trainer, or rider who has shown an objectionable attitude toward a recognized show or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a recognized show or to its management. Show committee reserves the right to combine/cancel unfilled classes; accept entries of unfilled classes at a regular fee; divide classes as entries warrant. Exhibitors will be advised of combined and cancelled/divided classes.

Exhibitors must appear in the ring suitably attired, with correct numbers clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition; entries with incorrect or missing numbers will be disqualified. If an exhibitor voluntarily removes a horse from the ring without permission of the judge, the exhibitor may be disqualified from all future classes at the show by the show committee and forfeit all prizes and entry fees for the entire show.

Age of an individual on December 1, 2019, is maintained the entire year. For horse show purposes, a horse becomes one year old on January 1 following the actual foaling date.

Class Awards: Ribbons to 6th place will be given.

High Point Awards: High Point awards are as listed on the entry form. High Points may be split to reflect new splits of classes. Please indicate the High Point(s) for which you wish to be considered.

Miscellaneous: Every class offered which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Northwest Saddle Club rulebook will be conducted and judged in accordance with said rules. Should the class not be covered in the NWSC rulebook, the show will defer to the rules delineated by the following: Washington State Horsemen and USEF for English, Western, In-Hand, Driving, Trail; AQHA (for stock type) and AHA (for non-stock type) for all ranch horse classes.

Classes may be split or combined at the discretion of the show management.

The decision of the judge is final. No one shall approach the judge with regard to a decision unless he/she first obtains permission from the show committee and steward, who shall arrange an appointment at a proper time and place. Approaching the judge without permission of the show committee and steward shall result in immediate disqualification and forfeiture of all entry fees.

Protests must be in writing, signed, and addressed to the show secretary, received by the show manager within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation and be accompanied by a \$100.00 deposit, which is forfeited if the objection is not sustained.

Veterinarian will be on call and phone number will be posted in the office. All vet calls are subject to payment when services are rendered.

FAIRGROUNDS/SHOW RULES

EXHIBITORS MUST CLEAN UP AFTER THEMSELVES AND THEIR HORSES ANYWHERE ON THE SHOWGROUNDS.

ALL RIDING IS LIMITED TO THE WALTON BEVERAGE WARM-UP ARENA AND WASHINGTON TRACTOR ARENA. NO RIDING ALLOWED AT ANY TIME IN THE SALISH WEALTH MANAGEMENT HORSE BARN.

STALLS:

- All stalls are locked with a zip tie. Do NOT break any zip ties. Stalls will be assigned by show management.
- Only 1 horse per stall.
- Do NOT lock horse in stall.
- Please pitch stalls into the aisle prior to leaving the fairgrounds.
- First bale of shavings is included with stall. Additional baled shavings are available for purchase.

LOAD/UNLOAD/PARKING:

- Enter Gate 7 and unload in front of Salish Wealth Management Horse Barn and promptly move truck and trailer to Lot 8 parking.
- Do NOT unload on the pavement north of the arena. Horses are to be kept off the blacktop north of the barn/arenas at all times.
- Truck, trailer, and RV parking is available in Lot 8. Spectators may park north of barn/arenas.
- Haul-ins are allowed ONLY on Lot 8. Horses are not to be left unattended. Unattended horses will be given a stall and the owner/responsible party billed for a day stall.

MISCELLANEOUS:

- Dogs must be on leash at all times. **Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their dog.** Dogs may not roam free in any of the barns or on the grounds.
- No smoking allowed inside any buildings, and Washington state law prohibits smoking within 25' of any doorway, window, staircase, or building intake systems.
- No parking or blocking of fire lanes, fire hydrants, building/barn entryways, exits, or access gates.
- At no times are shavings to be distributed in barn walkways or aisle ways.
- Heaters are not allowed in stalls.
- Sleeping in the barn is not allowed.
- Leave no trace – all manure must be picked up, and pack out trash or deposit in available garbage receptacles.

AGREEMENT: Every entry at a Recognized Competition constitutes an agreement that the person making it, be that owner, lessee, trainer, manager agent, coach, driver, rider, or handler, and the horse are subject to the Bylaws and Rules of NWSC. Every exhibitor, rider, driver, or handler, coach and trainer or his/her agent(s) must sign an entry blank. In the case of a rider, driver, or handler under the age of 18, his/her parent or guardian must sign an entry blank on the minor's behalf. If any of the above persons fails to do so, his/her first entrance into the warm up arena as an exhibitor, rider, driver, or handler shall be construed as his/her acceptance of the rules of the competition involved and of NWSC and shall ipso facto render him/her subject to said rule. Upon the failure of an owner, trainer, rider, driver, handler, coach, or agent(s), parent or guardian or trainer of a minor rider, driver, or handler to sign an entry blank as required, and upon confirmation of any such violation(s) by the Steward or Secretary of the competition, such person(s) shall be subject to a fine of \$50.00, imposed for such violation.

I hereby certify that I qualify for amateur standing and understand that if proven otherwise, I will forfeit all NWSC points earned in NWSC-approved equitation and showmanship classes.

Regardless of one's equestrian skills and/or accomplishments, a person is an amateur for all competitions conducted who after his/her 18th birthday has not engaged in any of the following activities which would make him/her a professional.

1. Accepts remuneration for riding, driving, showing in halter/in hand, training schooling or conducting clinics or seminars.
2. Accepts remuneration for giving instruction in equitation or horse training. Persons acting as counselors at summer camps or giving training to the handicapped are excluded.
3. Rides, drives or shows in halter/in hand competitions, any horse for which he/she or a member of his/her family or a corporation which a member of his/her family controls, receives remuneration for boarding, training, riding, driving or showing.
4. Gives instruction to any person or rides, drives or shows in competitions any horse, for which activity another person in his/her family or corporation which a member of his/her family controls will receive remuneration for the activity.

Receiving monies from classes that offer scholarship bonds or premium monies from local fairs is exempt from both Jr. and Sr. Amateur. See the USEF Rulebook for a complete listing of activities that do not affect the amateur status of a person. The following activities do not affect the amateur status of a person who is otherwise qualified:

1. The writing of books or articles pertaining to horses.
2. Accepting remuneration for officiating as a judge, steward, technical delegate, course designer, announcer or participating as a TV commentator, or accepting bona fide remuneration for services as a veterinarian, groom, farrier, tack shop operator or breeder, or for accepting bona fide remuneration for boarding services.
3. Accepting reimbursement for expenses without profit.
4. Accepting a token of appreciation, other than money, for riding, driving or showing in halter/in hand. (Note: Horse board, prize money, partial support or objects of more than \$300 are considered remuneration, not small tokens of appreciation). (Also note; accepting any amount of money, whether more or less than \$300 is considered remuneration.) Prize money won by an amateur- owner rider/driver/handler in any class (other than equitation or showmanship) is not considered remuneration.
5. Having the occupation of veterinarian, groom, farrier or owning a tack shop or breeding or boarding stable in itself, does not affect the amateur status of a person who is otherwise qualified.
6. Any person who is serving an internship for college credit through his/her respective, accredited college program, and who has never held professional status can accept reimbursement for expenses without profit.
